Examination Rules

- 7. Students should know that Alberta Education uses computer technology to compare student answer sheets to ensure that students have "not inaccurately represented their performance."
- 8. Students who interfere with security by violating these rules may
 - a. Be evicted from the exam room.
 - b. Have their diploma invalidated.
 - c. Be barred from writing for one year.
 - d. Have transcripts withheld for one year.
- 9. Have transcripts annotated.

The school organizes a graduation ceremony to recognize and celebrate the achievements of the graduating class. The graduation ceremony consists of two events - the convocation and the banquet.

To participate in the graduation ceremony, students must meet the following criteria:

- Have Kate Andrews as the official school of record.
- Have completed or be in the process of completing the necessary courses required to earn an Alberta High School Diploma, Certificate of Achievement, or Certificate of Completion by the end of June.
- Have completed the majority of the credits earned during their grade 12 year at Kate Andrews High School.
- Have completed 75% of their coursework in any Distance Education,
 Correspondence, Work Experience, Special Projects, Music by Private Study, or Pass+ Courses by June 1st.
- Have all outstanding school fees and sports fees paid by June 1st.
- Have returned all textbooks and materials to the school.

In March, a letter was sent out to parents explaining whether or not their child is eligible to participate in the graduation ceremony and whether or not their child is on track to receive an Alberta High School Diploma, Certificate of Achievement, or Certificate of Completion in June of 2014.

A student who is eligible to participate in the graduation ceremony may participate in the following:

- To be introduced at the convocation.
- To receive the graduation scroll at the convocation.
- To be included in the graduating class group photograph.
- Purchase tickets for the banquet.

A Grade 12 student who has Kate Andrews as the official school of record but does not qualify for the graduation ceremony may not participate in the activities listed above. However, that student can have an individual graduation photograph taken that will be included in the class collage that is displayed in the school hallway. This student may, at the discretion of the Principal, also purchase tickets to attend the banquet.

Rehearsal

Rehearsal for the commencement ceremonies will be held on Thursday, June 26th at 1:00 p.m. at Southminster United Church, 1011 - 4th Avenue South in Lethbridge.

All eligible students must attend the rehearsal.

This will take approximately 2 hours if everyone is on time.

Convocation Ceremony

Eligible students must be at Southminster United Church by 1:30 PM on Friday, June 27th. Ceremony starts at 2:00 pm.

No tickets are required for spectators - admission is free to all.

A professional photographer will be on hand to take individual photographs as each student receives their graduation scroll.

The graduating class group photograph will be taken immediately following the ceremony. The individual and group photographs will be provided to each eligible graduate free of charge. The photographers will do their best to have both of these photos ready for the grads to pick up at the Banquet.

Banquet

The banquet will be held on Friday, June 27th at 5:30 pm at The Lethbridge Lodge.

A ticket to the banquet must be purchased for each person attending.

All graduating students who are attending the banquet must meet upstairs by 5:15 PM. Students will be arranged alphabetically by last name and individually introduced to those attending the banquet.

If any of your banquet guests require a special meal, please indicate this when you make your ticket purchase.

<u>Ticket sales</u> will be during the noon break in Mrs. Pritchard's room starting on June 2nd and ending on June 5th. <u>Tickets will only be sold at noon from 11:45 to 12:30.</u>

The cost of each ticket is \$35. This cost helps to cover the meal and gratuity, decorations, and grad booklets.

On the first day of ticket sales, Graduation Committee and Decorating Committee members will have first choice of tickets and seating followed by students with exemplary attendance. All other tickets will be sold on a first come, first pay basis, which will determine where one sits at the banquet. Each student will be allowed to purchase up to a maximum of 6 tickets initially. Once all students have had a chance to purchase 6 tickets, more tickets may be purchased if space is available.

Inter-Denominational Service

In the past, inter-denominational services have been held at various churches in Coaldale. Students will be informed of details at a later date.

Safe Grad and Super Grad

Safe Grad and Super Grad are not an official part of the graduation ceremony and are not school sanctioned events.
