Principal's Report for Kate Andrews School Council – May 17/16

- 1. We have purchased 52 chrome books from our surplus funds. We now have 100 chrome books in addition to our computers in the lab and library. Literacy resources have also been purchased in addition to equipment for the Foods and Science labs. We had Board allocated funds of \$44,000 and have spent \$39,000 thus far.
- 2. The US Eastern Seaboard trip was a huge success. Details and pictures were in our May newsletter.
- 3. Grad 2016 Plans are being finalized by staff and students. Check our website for details. Grad is Wednesday, June 29. The Grad ceremony at the College Drive Church starts at 1:00 PM. The awards committee is busy gathering information to begin the process of selecting award winners. The Valedictorian is Tori Lutz.
- 4. We are still waiting for our school review workshop. We hope to have that take place by mid-June.
- 5. The master schedule for next year has been completed. We are hoping to coordinate training on Power School soon so that we can input the information electronically. In the meantime, we will meet with students to develop their individual schedules. Master schedule have to be reviewed again.
- 6. Extra-Curricular:
 - a. Sports News:
 - Baseball and Soft Ball Teams are involved in league and tournament play.
 - Track Students will be participating in a track meet next week
 - Badminton The season is over. Several students had fun completing.
 - b. Drama: Our students presented the play "4 AM" in the first week of May. Also students performed "Shed the Mask" and a one act competition at the U of L.
 - c. Music: We had over 50 band and choir students participate in the Palliser Band day in Vulcan on May 4. Our students will be performing at the Coaldale Musical Art Society on June 10, 6:30 PM, at R.I. Baker.
- 7. Our four Brazilian students will be leaving for home on June 17.

Dear Honorable Mr. Eggen,

Our School Council is writing this letter to express our concern about the need for much more pension planning to be incorporated into the high school curriculum. Currently very little is addressed in the Career and Life Management (CALM) program.

We would like to ask when the CALM course was last reviewed and updated, and/or is it past due for an assessment? We do recognize and appreciate that a recently introduced course called "Financial Management" has been made available to students, but because it is not mandatory, we believe all students will not access it. In a time when the government is pleading and encouraging Albertans/Canadians to participate and invest in pensions, we must start with our youth and provide them with this information through our education programs.

May we caution that introducing pension planning should not be done through corporate presentations, but be mandatory, more concise and indepth as part of the CALM course itself.

We appreciate you taking the time to address this very important issue/concern and look forward to your response.

Palliser considers panel change to allow for review

The Board of Trustees plan to press ahead with an independent, external review of Palliser Regional Schools operations with a change to the panel's composition.

At a special board meeting Tuesday, trustees voted unanimously to proceed with the review under a two-member panel, rather than three as initially proposed. The board's legal counsel has been directed to prepare final agreements for board review and consideration for approval at the May 24 regular meeting.

Superintendent Kevin Gietz had requested in January that the board approve an independent review of the school system in order to reduce distractions caused by a flurry of online allegations. The board agreed and formed a committee to come up with candidates for a three-person review panel. In March that committee recommended three individuals, and the board approved a budget to cover the cost of their services plus expenses. Within days, however, it was determined the budget amount exceeded limits allowed under a provincial trade agreement without the matter being put up for public tender or a request for proposal.

The three candidates were then asked to resubmit their proposal so the total cost of the review would not exceed \$74,999.99. Earlier this month the board announced that the three had declined to sign the service contracts presented to them.

Vice-Chair Robert Strauss was asked to contact the three potential review members to determine why they had declined to sign the service contracts presented to them.

On Tuesday, Chair Colleen Deitz said the board had conversations with two of the three review panel candidates and with legal counsel. As a result, the board agreed to proceed with a two-member panel and change the terms of reference of the review to allow for that.

The names of the two reviewers will be released once the contracts are signed.
